

## A Creative Commons License Primer

You must meet three criteria to be eligible to use a Creative Commons (CC) license:

1. Copyright must exist in the work being licensed.
2. You must be the copyright owner of the work to place a CC license on it. For example, if you created the work as part of your employment, you may not be the copyright owner. If you assigned the copyright to someone else, you're no longer its copyright owner.
3. If you're in an exclusive or even non-exclusive licensing arrangement, including as a member of a copyright collective, you may be restricted from using CC licenses. Check your licensing arrangement for any restrictions about CC licenses.

### The Licenses

<b>Key:</b> • CC = Creative Commons • BY = Attribution Required • NC = Noncommercial Use Only • SA = Sharealike (for derivatives) • ND = No Derivatives or Remixes	
<b>Attribution CC BY</b>	The least restrictive license, it allows the public to freely distribute your work and also remix it, for commercial or noncommercial purposes. Attribution to you is required.
<b>Attribution-NoDerivs CC BY-ND</b>	This license allows the public to distribute the work as is (no modifications) for commercial or noncommercial purposes. Attribution to you is required.
<b>Attribution-Sharealike CC BY-SA</b>	This license allows the public to remix, tweak, et cetera, and the resulting new work must also be subject to this same CC license. The use can be for commercial or noncommercial purposes. Attribution to you is required.
<b>Attribution-Noncommercial CC BY-NC</b>	If you use this license, the public may remix, tweak and build upon the work (i.e., make a new work incorporating the original). The resulting new work must be noncommercial. Attribution to you is required.
<b>Attribution-Noncommercial-Sharealike CC BY-NC-SA</b>	This license allows the public to remix or adapt the work, et cetera, but only for noncommercial purposes. The resulting new work must use the same CC license. Attribution to you is required.
<b>Attribution-Noncommercial-NoDerivs CC BY-NC-ND</b>	This is the most restrictive license. Attribution to you is required and the public may: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Download the work and share it with others</li> <li>• Use the work as is without any modifications</li> <li>• Do any of the above only for noncommercial purposes</li> </ul>
